The Coronavirus: What to Do

What to watch for:

Symptoms including, fever, cough, and shortness of breath.

In adults, emergency warning signs* that require immediate treatment:

- 1. Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- 2. Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- 3. New confusion or inability to arouse
- 4. Bluish lips or face

*This list is not all inclusive. Please consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning.

What to do if you get sick:

- Stay home and call your doctor.
- Call your healthcare provider and let them know about your symptoms. Tell
 them that you have or may have COVID-19. This will help them take care of
 you and keep other people from getting infected or exposed.
- If you are not sick enough to be hospitalized, you can recover at home. Follow CDC instructions for how to take care of yourself at home.
- Know when to get emergency help.
- Get medical attention immediately if you have any of the emergency warning signs listed above.

Who is at higher risk?

- People who have serious chronic medical conditions like:
- Heart disease
- Diabetes
- Lung disease

Family and caregiver support:

- Know what medications your loved one is taking and see if you can help them have extra on hand.
- Monitor food and other medical supplies (oxygen, incontinence, dialysis, wound care) needed and create a back-up plan.
- Stock up on non-perishable food to have on hand in your home to minimize trips to stores.
- If you care for a loved one living in a care facility, monitor the situation, ask about
 the health of the other residents frequently and know the protocol if there is an
 outbreak.

What is Social Distancing?

Social distancing is critical during a pandemic (Mounk Y, "Cancel Everything," The Atlantic, March 10, 2020). However, this phrase seems often misinterpreted as simply staying far away from others, even in one-on-one or small-group settings. In fact, this means canceling larger events altogether.

For Goshen students

Food Pantries in Orange County New York

If you are an Orange County New York resident and need food, call or stop by a local food bank or pantry for assistance. While they mostly depend on donations from the community in order to operate, the centers can provide items such as perishable food stuff, canned goods, baby formula, and fruits and vegetables.

Each pantry is open limited hours and it is recommended to call in advance for hours and/or to set up an appointment. If a location can't meet your need, a social worker or volunteer can often refer someone to other local charities, churches, community action agencies, or non-profit organizations in the region.
